## **GENERAL CONDITIONS AND ADMINISTRATION**

# 1 Entry and Registration

- 1.1 The owner(s) of a boat intending to participate must complete a registration form and submit payment of the registration fee(s) with a signed liability waiver, before the boat is allowed to race and/or be scored.
- 1.2 The Registration Deadline is 21:00, July 25th, 2024. No grace period will be granted.
- 1.3 The Race Management Committee reserves the right to refuse and/or rescind entry of any boat found to be operating in an unsafe or in a manner contrary to RRS 69.

# 2 Classes and Eligibility

- 2.1A minimum of three (3) fleets will be hosted in the regatta:
- 2.1.1 **FS** Flying Sails (Spinnakers)
- 2.1.2 **NFS** Non-Flying Sails (Jib or Genoa and Main only)
- 2.1.3 **FUN** Fun Race Fleet Non-Flying Sails only
- 2.2 Fleets may be further subdivided by the Organizing Authority if participant numbers warrant, this subdivision will be based on PHRF-LO or assigned ratings.
- 2.3 Each participating keelboat in Flying Sails and Non-Flying Sails fleets must have a valid PHRF-LO certificate.
- 2.4 For the FS and NFS fleets the PHRF-LO Point to Point Time Correction Factor will be used for scoring.
- 2.5 For the competitors in Fun Race, a handicap will be assigned based on either a valid

PHRF-LO certificate or a rating as assigned by the Race Management Committee.

- 2.6 The Fun Race Fleet will use the PHRF-LO TOT Factor or the assigned rating converted to a time correction factor of A = 650, B = 550 + Rating.
- 2.7 The division splits will be presented at the Skipper's Meeting announced via either verbal or electronic means and this communication will be at the sole discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 2.8 Eligibility in the Fun Race will be subject to review by the Race Management Committee based on the following the below:
- 2.8.1 Helmspersons and/or keelboats which do not normally race in weekly Basin events or other competitive events will be eligible for the Fun Race.
- 2.8.2 In situations where a Fun Race registrant has known and/or extensive racing experience the Race Management Committee <u>may</u> use the vessel's handicap as a tool to adjust for this experience.
- 2.8.3 Registrants with racing experience per 2.8.1 will be allowed to substitute or designated a lesser experienced helmsperson.
- 2.8.4 These determinations will be made by the Race Management Committee at their sole discretion and not subject to protest.

# 3 Inspection and Measurement

3.1 Each participating boat is subject verification of compliance to all applicable rules and if found in non-compliance may be disqualified from the race at the sole discretion of the Organizing Authority.

# 4 Entry Fee, Waiver and Insurance

- 4.1 The entry fees:
  - 4.1.1 Basin Open \$20
  - 4.1.2 Fees are payable by e-transfer to treasurer@bpyc.on.ca
  - 4.1.3 Non-payment will result in the entry being null and void.
- 4.2 All Skippers must sign the Insurance Certification and acknowledge they and their crew have reviewed the appropriate Rowan's Law Concussion Awareness Resources. All Skippers or their representatives must sign the Waiver, Release of Liability and Indemnification Agreement on behalf of their Crew.
- 4.3 Each participating keelboat shall be insured with valid liability insurance of at least \$2,000,000 (Canadian) or a valid US insurance as allowed by the Organizing Authority.
- 4.4 Proof of Insurance may be requested at check-in time and at any other time.

# 5 Check-in and Mooring

- 5.1 Check-in will be at the SBSC Club House on the top floor on July 27<sup>th</sup> from approximately 09:00.
- 5.2 Participants are encouraged to arrive on the evening of July 26<sup>th.</sup>
- 5.3 Please see the basin map at the end of this document for locations of clubs. Note the basin entry buoys have no lighting and are subject to shifting.

# **6** Sailing Instruction Information

6.1 These Sailing Instructions will be available for electronic distribution from the Race Management Committee upon registration. A printed copy will be available for viewing during Onsite Check-in.

# 7 Competitor's Briefing (Skippers' Meeting)

7.1A mandatory Skippers' Meeting will be on July 27th at 10:00 at SBSC, all Skippers or their designate must attend in person or risk disqualification.

#### 8 Schedule of Race

8.1 Will take place on July 27th, 2024 with as first Warning Signal at 11:00.

## 9 Rules and Regulations

- 9.1 All races shall be governed by the current version of the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) as published by World Sailing and amendments as modified by the prescription of Sail Canada and these sailing instructions.
- 9.2 Boats must comply with the applicable sections of the Canada Shipping Act, 2001 to be eligible to compete to this race. Non-compliance will result in automatic disqualification from the race without appeal or recourse to the organizing authority.
- 9.3 The sailing instructions contained in the <u>Bluffers Basin Challenge Series Racing</u> <u>Handbook and Sailing Instructions 2024-05-06</u> (Basin Handbook) will apply to this regatta. https://www.bpyc.on.ca/documents/2024/2024 Basin Race Handbook.pdf

#### 10 Amendments to RRS and Basin Handbook

# 10.1 Changes in Sailing Instructions

Additions, changes, and exceptions to these Sailing Instructions may be made in

writing (i.e. as a *Notice to Racers*) at any time and <u>may</u> be posted on the Racing Notice Boards in Bluffers Park Yacht Club, Cathedral Bluffs Yacht Club, Highland Yacht Club and Scarborough Bluffs Sailing Club a minimum of 24 hours before they take effect or transmitted electronically to other clubs or competitors as the Organizing Authority deems fit. *Failure to notify individual entrants shall not be grounds for redress*.

- 10.1.1 All boats shall comply with the applicable safety equipment regulations of the Canada Shipping Act, 2001 (or those standards as required by the country of registration of the vessel) to be eligible to compete to this race. Non-compliance will result in automatic disqualification from the race without appeal or recourse to the organizing authority, and any observed violations of laws may be reported to the appropriate authories.
- 10.1.2 **OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY**: The safety of a boat and her crew is the sole responsibility of the owner(s) and/or skipper who must ensure that the boat is sound, fully seaworthy, manned by experienced crew and adequately insured. They must be satisfied as to the soundness of the hull, spars, rigging, sails and gear. He/she must ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained and stowed and that the crew is familiar with its location and trained it the use of such equipment.
- 10.1.3 It is the sole responsibility of the skipper and crew of each boat to decide whether or not to start, continue in, or retire from a race, as per RSS 4. By starting any particular race the skipper accepts to abide by the sailing instructions.
- 10.1.4 All keelboats must have an operational VHF radio on board during the race. A watch on VHF Channel 16 must be maintained.

# 10.2 **Retiring Boats**

Retiring boats are required to inform the Race Management Committee before leaving the course or as soon as possible thereafter, that they have retired from the race.

#### 10.3 Radio Communications

- 10.3.1 The Race Management Committee will monitor, make any announcements and communicate with boat(s) in the race over VHF Channel 71.
- 10.3.2 Failure of the Race Management Committee to make a broadcast or the failure of a boat to hear a broadcast shall not be grounds for redress.

#### 10.4 Motor Use

Rule 42.1 is modified to permit the use of an engine for generating electrical power provided that such use does not advance the sailboat's position and the use of an engine

- 11.1.1 **Start:** A line formed by Bluffers Basin Mark 0 and the yellow flag on the Race Committee boat.
- 11.1.2 **Finish:** A line formed by Bluffers Basin Mark 0 and the blue flag on the Race Committee boat. If the Race Committee boat is no longer on station the Finish will be a line between Bluffers Basin Mark 0 and Mark 1 no further than 50 metres North of Mark 0. Competitors' finish times will be self-reported and communicated to the Race Committee.
- 11.1.3 All Rounding Marks of the Course to be kept to PORT.
- 11.1.4 The Rounding Marks of the course are not maintained by the BBRMC. If a mark is absent from the locations noted above, it shall not be grounds from redress, this modifies RRS 62.1.

#### 12 COURSE TO BE SAILED

- 12.1 BASIN OPEN REGATTA for FS and NFS Competitors
- 12.2 <u>The Race Committee will designate the Course to be sailed using the East or West, Regular or Short Course Marks as described below.</u>
- 12.3 **East Course:** Start → East Regular or Short → Finish
- 12.4 **West Course**: Start → West Regular or Short → Finish
- **12.5 FUN RACES**
- 12.6 **East Course:** Start → East Short → Finish
- 12.7 <u>West Course</u>: Start → West Short → Finish

## 13 AWARDS

- 13.1 Flags for division winners in First (1st), Second (2nd) and Third (3rd) place.
- 13.2 Flags will be awarded in a manner to be determined by the Organizing Authority.
